
# Supported Employment

## IPS Services:

- Job Interview Preparation
- Job Attire/Travel Expense Support
- Supportive Services/Benefits Planning
- Continued Job Maintenance Support



Benefits planning will be provided to all individuals placed in IPS services to provide counseling, information and answer any questions or concerns about how the income from working will influence their benefits.



## IPS Practice & Principles:

IPS supported employment helps people with mental illness work at regular jobs of their choosing. Although variations of supported employment exist, IPS (Individual Placement and Support) refers to the evidence-based practice of supported employment.



Individual Placement and Support is a partnership between Compass Health Network, Missouri Vocational Rehabilitation (part of DESE) and the Missouri Department of Mental Health.
