

THE RECOVERY PROCESS

Recovery from opioid use initially centers around physical stabilization; specifically, the management of opioid withdrawal. This is an essential step to reduce symptoms related to withdrawing from opioids.

Medication Assisted Treatment is the use of medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to provide a "whole-patient" approach to the treatment of substance use disorders. The Opioid Treatment Program provides the option of being prescribed medication in a safe, controlled environment to overcome the use of an opioid.

There is no "one size fits all" approach to opioid use treatment. People who use opioids benefit from treatment for varying lengths of time, including lifelong treatment. Ongoing outpatient medication treatment is linked to better outcomes than treatment without medication.

A comprehensive wellness approach assists the individual to stabilize, feel relief from withdrawal symptoms, and establish and maintain recovery. When a person participates in a recovery program, they are taking steps toward managing their substance use and regaining a healthy life.

Medications offered through the Opioid Treatment Program includes methadone, Suboxone, buprenorphine, naltrexone and Vivitrol.

BENEFITS OF OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAM

- Medication manages opioid withdrawal symptoms
- Methadone is only offered at a specialized Opioid Treatment Program
- Daily dispensing of methadone and other medications when recommended
- Medication provided onsite
- Individualized service approach
- Defined criteria for program progression to decrease daily dispensing

COMPREHENSIVE WELLNESS APPROACH

- Intake assessment physical exam and medication assessment
- Lab Services urine drug screening, pregnancy, HIV, Hepatitis, and TB testing
- Dispensing medication methadone, suboxone, and naltrexone
- Medication management with physician and nursing services
- Individual counseling
- Group education and group counseling
- Overdose education and Narcan kits
- Integrated Health Specialists provide support and education in the community and connection to community resources
- Peer Specialists share their lived experience and provide information and support in accessing community recovery meetings
