## Substance Awareness Traffic Offender Program (SATOP)



## What is SATOP?

The Substance Awareness Traffic Offender Program (SATOP) is an education and intervention program established by the Missouri Legislature in 1993. Completion of a SATOP program may be a driving privilege reinstatement requirement for anyone who has had an alcohol, drug, or chemical refusal related driving offense in Missouri.

## How does it work?

Step one of the SATOP process is to complete the DRI-II assessment with a SATOP qualified professional. This assessment will determine which level of SATOP education/intervention you will need to complete.

## What is the cost?

The DRI Assessment fee is \$375.00. Education and intervention program fees vary according to the level of services.

## SATOP Comparable

A SATOP Comparable maybe processed for \$295 if the following state requirements are met: At least 120 hours of treatment successfully completed in one continuous episode of care by a certified ADA provider, (40 of the 120 must be counseling hours), provide comparable documents signed by treatment provider and verified before processing is scheduled, contact Department of Mental Health for Processing Out of State and DOC treatment reinstatement requests.



## Offender Education Program (OEP)

A ten hour education program that assists individuals in understanding the effects of drinking on their driving skills, choices they made that led to their intoxication and arrest. The focus is on educating offenders on the consequences of their actions and recognizing other options for the future.

## Weekend Interventions Program (WIP)?

A 48 consecutive hour intervention program provided in a structured environment. This service level is designed primarily for repeat or assessed “high risk” offenders. Services will include intensive group education and individual counseling intervention methods.

## Clinical Intervention Program (CIP)

A 50 hour intensive outpatient program based on the needs of persistent or assessed “high risk” offenders. This program is designed to be completed in a minimum of five weeks. Services will include individual counseling, group counseling, group education, and substance use testing.

## Level IV or Serious and Repeat Offender Program (SROP)

A 75-hour intensive outpatient intervention program based on the needs of persistent or assessed “high risk” offenders. This program is designed to be completed in a minimum of 90 days. Services will included individual counseling, group counseling, group education, and substance use testing.
