What is SATOP?

The Substance Awareness Traffic Offender Program (SATOP) is a Missouri program that provides education and intervention for alcohol or drug related driving offenses. SATOP was established by the Missouri Legislature in 1993. Completion of a SATOP program may be required to reinstate driving privileges after an alcohol, drug, or chemical refusal driving offense.

How does it work?

The first step in the SATOP process is completed a DRI-II assessment with a SATOP Qualified Professional. The results of this assessment determine which level of SATOP education or intervention program you must complete.

What is the cost?

The DRI Assessment fee is \$375.00. Fees for education and intervention programs vary based on the level of services required.



Offender Education Program (OEP)

The OEP is a 10-hour class that helps participants understand how drinking affects driving. The class discusses decisions that led to drinking and driving, the impact of those decisions and ways to make safer choices in the future.

Weekend Interventions Program (WIP)?

The WIP is a 48-hour weekend program for repeat or high-risk DWI offenders. Participants take part in group classes, individual counseling, and activities that focus on behavior change and making safer choices.

Clinical Intervention Program (CIP)

The CIP is a 50-hour intensive outpatient program for individuals whose assessment shows a higher risk related to alcohol or drug use. The program is usually completed in at least five weeks. Participants attend individual counseling, group counseling, group education, and substance use testing.

Level IV or Serious and Repeat Offender Program (SROP)

The SROP/Level IV is a 75-hour intensive outpatient program for individuals whose assessment shows a serious level of risk related to alcohol or drug use. The program length has a minimum of 90 days, where participants attend individual counseling, group counseling, group education, and complete substance use testing.

SATOP Comparable

A SATOP Comparable may be processed for a fee of \$295 if certain requirements are met. To qualify, an individual must have successfully completed at least 120 hours of substance use treatment in one continuous episode of care through a certified SUD treatment agency. At least 40 of the 120 hours must be counseling hours. Comparable documents must be provided, signed by the treatment provider, and verified before the processing can be scheduled.

For treatment completed out of state or through the Department of Corrections, individuals must contact the Missouri Department of Mental Health for reinstatement processing.
